Counsel for the respondents.</p> <p>The Review Applicant has filed this application under Rule 18 of the Armed Forces Tribunal (Procedure) Rules, 2008 by which applicant has prayed for review and setting aside the judgement and order dated 18.01.2021 of this Tribunal passed in Original Application No. 696 of 2017 on the ground that the Tribunal fell into error by construing the claim for service pension and disability pension is arising out of same cause of action i.e. discharge from service and applying provision of Order II Rule 2 of Code of Civil Procedure which is contrary to the provision of Rule 10 of the Armed Forces Tribunal (Procedure) Rules, 2008 wherein it is provided that one or more relief can be sought for single cause of action provided that they are consequential to one another. The order dated 18.01.201 reads as under:-</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><i>“8. In view of above law, we are of the opinion that applicant in Original Application No. 259 of 2013 ought to have included whole of the claim i.e. second service pension and disability pension to which the applicant was entitled in respect of the same cause of action i.e. discharge from DSC service or ought to have sought the leave of the Tribunal to file a fresh Original Application which he did not do. Since the applicant has utterly failed to follow the law, his present Original Application for grant of disability pension is not permissible in law.</i></p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><i>9. In view of the above, the Original Application is devoid of merit and deserves to be dismissed. It is accordingly dismissed.”</i></p> <p>It is a settled proposition of law that the scope of the review is limited and until it is shown that there is error apparent on the face of record in the judgment and order sought to be reviewed, the same cannot be reviewed. For ready reference, Order 47, Rule 1 sub-rule (1) of the Code of Civil</p>

Procedure, 1908 is reproduced below :-

"1. Application for review of judgment.- (1) any person considering himself aggrieved-

(a) by a decree or order from which an appeal is allowed, but from which no appeal has been preferred,

(b) by a decree or order from which no appeal is allowed, or

(c) by a decision on a reference from a Court of Small Causes, and who, from the discovery of new and important matter or evidence which, after the exercise of due diligence, was not within his knowledge or could not be produced by him at the time when the decree was passed or order made, or on account of some mistake or error apparent on the face of the record , or for any other sufficient reason, desires to obtain a review of the decree passed or order made against him, may apply for a review of judgment to the Court which passed the decree or made the order."

In view of the principles of law laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in various decisions, it is settled that the scope of review jurisdiction is very limited and re-hearing is not permissible. The Hon'ble Supreme Court in Para 9 of its judgment in the case of ***Parsion Devi and others vs. Sumitri Devi and others***, reported in (1997) 8 Supreme Court Cases 715, has observed as under :-

"9. Under Order 47, Rule 1 CPC a judgment may be open to review inter alia if there is a mistake or an error apparent on the face of the record. An error which is not self- evident and has to be detected by a process of reasoning, can hardly be said to be an error apparent on the face of the record justifying the court to exercise its power of review under Order 47, Rule 1 CPC. In exercise of the jurisdiction under Order 47, Rule 1 CPC it is not permissible for an erroneous decision to be "reheard and corrected". There is a clear distinction between an erroneous decision and an error apparent on the face of the record. While the first can be corrected by the higher forum, the latter only can be corrected by exercise of the review jurisdiction. A review petition has a limited purpose and cannot be allowed to be "an appeal in disguise."

We have gone through the judgment and order sought to be reviewed and no illegality or irregularity or error apparent on the face of record being found therein, we are of the view that there is no force in the grounds taken in the review application so that order may be reviewed.

In the result, Review Application is **rejected**.

Subedar Grade) to the applicant with effect from 01.12.2016.</p> <p>There is a delay of 12 years, 09 months and 13 days in filing Original Application.</p> <p>Submission of Ld. Counsel for the applicant in this regard is that applicant was discharged from service on 30.06.2007. Hi further submission is that applicant made an Appeal before the respondents for the grant of MACP 3rd (Nb.
