It is settled in law that if time limit is given for filing of any application and the same is not filed within that time limit, delay should be explained on day to day basis which applicant has utterly failed in the present case.

In the result, we find that delay is not condonable.

Accordingly, delay condonation application is **dismissed**.

The instant Original Application has been filed by the applicants for setting aside Notice of termination of employment dated 19.07.2021 issued by President Air Force Wives Welfare Association (AFWWA) ITI Air Force Station Kanpur.

Learned Counsel for the respondents has raised a preliminary objection and has submitted that the applicants are neither enrolled nor attested as such they are not subject to the provisions of the Army Act, 1950, the Navy Act, 1957 and Air Force Act, 1950 hence, instant Original Application is not maintainable in this Tribunal and it is liable to be dismissed on this very ground.

His further submission is that in the instant Original Application the applicants have raised their grievances that they have served in AFWWA ITI Air Force Station, Kanpur for about 15 years and this Institute was governed by the Indian Air Force, hence this case be decided by the Armed Forces Tribunal is not correct. The applicants are civilian employee and they cannot be termed as complainant for the adjudication regarding service as they are not subject to Air Force Act, 1950. He pleaded for dismissal of the Original Application being not maintainable.

In reply to above, Ld. Counsel for the applicants submitted that services of the applicants in pursuance of notification dated 19.07.2021, issued by President AFWWA ITI, Air Force Station, Kanpur have been terminated. AFWWA ITI, Air Force Station, Kanpur is controlled by Indian Air Force, hence they are governed by rules and regulations of Air Force and this Tribunal is empowered to decide their case. He pleaded that since the applicants were

working in AFWWA ITI, controlled by Indian Air Force, they may be treated as subject to Air Force Act, 1950.

Heard Ld. Counsel of both sides and perused the record.

Section 2 of the Armed Forces Tribunal Act, 2007, enumerates the persons, to whom the provisions of the said Act are applicable. It may be reproduced as follows:-

- "2. Applicability of the Act.- (1) The provisions of this Act shall apply to all persons subject to the Army Act, 1950 (46 of 1950), the Navy Act, 1957 (62 of 1957) and the Air Force Act, 1950 (45 of 1950).
- (2) This Act shall also apply to retired personnel subject to the Army Act, 1950 (46 of 1950) or the Navy Act, 1957 (62 of 1957) or the Air Force Act, 1950 (45 of 1950), including their dependants, heirs and successors, in so far as it relates to their service matters".

Section 14 of the Armed Forces Tribunal Act, 2007, in so far as it is relevant for the instant case, is reproduced as under:-

- "14. Jurisdiction, powers and authority in service matters .- (1) Save as otherwise expressly provided in this Act, the Tribunal shall exercise, on and from the appointed day, all the jurisdiction, powers and authority, exercisable immediately before that day by all courts (except the Supreme Court or a High Court exercising jurisdiction under article 226 and 227 of the Constitution) in relation to all service matters.
- (2) Subject to the other provisions of this Act, a person aggrieved by an order pertaining to any service matter may make an application to the Tribunal in such form and accompanied by such documents or other evidence and on payment of such fee as may be prescribed.
- (3) On receipt of an application relating to service matters, the Tribunal shall, if satisfied after due inquiry, as it may deem necessary, that it is fit for adjudication by it, admit such application; but where the Tribunal is not so satisfied, it may dismiss the application after recording its reasons in writing.

(5) The Tribunal shall decide both questions of law and facts that may be raised before it."

The "service matters" as defined in Section 3(o) of the Armed Forces

Tribunal Act, 2007, in so far as it is relevant for the instant case, is reproduced
as under:-

- "3(o) "service matters", in relation to the persons subject to the Army Act, 1950 (46 of 1950), the Navy Act, 1957 (62 of 1957) and the Air Force Act, 1950 (45 of 1950), mean all matters relating to the conditions of their service and shall include –
- (i) remuneration (including allowances), pension and other retirement benefits;
- (ii) tenure, including commission, appointment, enrolment, probation, confirmation, seniority, training, promotion, reversion, premature

retirement, superannuation, termination of service and penal deductions; (iii) summary disposal and trials where the punishment of dismissal is awarded;

(iv) Any other matter, whatsoever,

but shall not include matters relating to -"

Section 2 of the Air Force Act, 1950 enumerates the persons, to whom the provisions of the said Act are applicable. It may be reproduced as follows:

- "2. **Persons subject to this Act.-** The following persons shall be subject to this Act wherever they may be, namely:-
 - (a) officers and warrant officers of the Air Force;
 - (b) persons enrolled under this Act;
 - (c) persons belonging to the Regular Air Force Reserve or the Air Defence Reserve or the Auxiliary Air Force, in the circumstances specified in section 26 of the Reserve and Auxiliary Air Forces Act, 1952 (62 of 1952);]
 - (d) persons not otherwise subject to air force law, who, on active service, in camp, on the march, or at any frontier post specified by the Central Government by notification in this behalf, are employed by, or are in the service of, or are followers of, or accompany any portion of the Air Force.
- 3. **Termination of application of the Act-** Every person subject to this Act under clauses (a) to (g) of sub-section (1) shall remain so subject until duly retired, discharged, released, removed, dismissed or cashiered from the service."

A person aggrieved by an order pertaining to any service matter, may make an application to the Tribunal in view of Section 14(2) of the Armed Forces Tribunal Act, 2007. It clearly shows that the Original Application cannot be moved in the Armed Forces Tribunal, unless, the concerned person is aggrieved by an order pertaining to any service matter. The service matter has been defined in Section 3 (o) of the said Act. A bare perusal of the definition of "service matters" indicates that the concerned person must be subject to the Army Act, 1950, the Navy Act, 1957 or the Air Force Act, 1950, as the case may be. Section 2 of the Air Force Act, 1950, as referred to above, provides about the persons, who are subject to the provisions of the Air Force Act, 1950. It has not been disputed by learned Counsel for the applicants that the applicants have not been enrolled under the provisions of the Air Force Act, 1950. Learned Counsel for the applicants has not been able to show us that the cases of the applicants come within the purview of any of the clauses of section 2 of the Air Force Act, 1950. Thus, it is clear that the applicants are not subject to the provisions of the Air Force Act, 1950.

In the instant case, impugned order has been passed by President of AFWWA i.e. a Society Registered under Societies Registration Act, 1860 which is not subject of any of the three Acts i.e. the Army Act, 1950, the Navy Act, 1957 and the Air Force Act, 1950. Since the applicants are not subject to the provisions of the Air Force Act, 1950, they are not entitled to file Original Application under Section 14 of The Armed Forces Tribunal Act, 2007, in the Armed Forces Tribunal, because, they are not aggrieved by any order pertaining to any service matter. The service matters, as defined above, clearly indicates that it is a condition precedent that the concerned person must be subject to the Air Force Act, 1950, the Navy Act, 1957 or the Army Act, 1950, as the case may be. If the aggrieved persons are not subject to the provisions of any of the said Acts, they cannot be said to be aggrieved by any order pertaining to any service matter.

In view of the aforesaid discussion, we are of the considered view that the applicants are not subject to the provisions of the Air Force Act, 1950, and hence, the instant Original Application for adjudication of controversy involved in the present matter, is not maintainable and cannot be admitted for hearing, and it deserves to be dismissed at the admission stage itself. The objection raised by the Registry, with regard to lack of jurisdiction of this Tribunal, is perfectly valid.

Accordingly, the Original Application No. 653 of 2021, is **dismissed**. It is made clear that we have not entered into the merits of the case.

	has been said about the dismissal order dated 26.07.2018 nor the copy of the
	order has been filed. He further submitted that copy of dismissal order has
	not been served to the applicant till date, hence he could not challenge the
	same when O.A. was filed.
	On the other hand, learned counsel for the respondents submitted that
	applicant was aware about dismissal order dated 26.07.2018 when he filed the
	O.A., but he did not challenge the same in the O.A. Applicant has wrongly

alleged that dismissal order has not been served to him. He further submitted that amendment sought in the O.A. is barred by time as applicant has been silent for about more than four years.

He further submitted that amendment sought by the applicant if allowed will change the nature of the application. In para 8 of the counter affidavit dated 08.10.2018, the matter of dismissal is mentioned.

Upon hearing submissions of learned counsel both the parties and considering the facts and circumstances of the case, we are of the view that it

is settled in law that amendment application cannot be disallowed on the ground of delay unless barred in law. There is nothing to suggest that proposed amend is barred in law nor, if allowed, would change the nature of the O.A. Rather it may be helpful in avoiding multiplicity of proceedings between the parties. Hence amendment application is **allowed.**

Let amendment be incorporated and copy of amended O.A. be served to the respondents within a week. Respondents will have three weeks time to file supplementary counter affidavit to the amended portion of the O.A. next thereafter.
